
Drug Checking in Vancouver Coastal



Key Findings

- In March, a total of 1,382 drug checks were performed across the Vancouver Coastal Health region (8 access points).
- The percentage of all opioids testing positive for benzodiazepines by FTIR and/or test strip decreased from the previous month to 31.8% (183 of 575).
- Benzodiazepines were detected by FTIR in 14.3% of unregulated opioids (70 of 491), indicating their presence in higher concentrations. Of these, desalkylgidazepam was most frequently identified.
- Fluorofentanyl remained the most common opioid detected by FTIR (36.9%; 181 of 491), followed by fentanyl (23.6%; 116 samples). Notably, carfentanil was detected by FTIR in 2 samples.
- Xylazine, a veterinary tranquilizer, was detected by FTIR in 0.4% of unregulated opioids (2 of 491).






Components found in drug samples in March


Components in methamphetamine



Frequency (N=53)


There were additional compounds detected a single time each: Boric Acid, Cocaine Base, Uncertain Carbohydrate.

Components in unregulated opioids







*During the month of March, 31.8% of expected opioid samples tested positive for benzodiazepines using test strips in our partner sites in Vancouver Coastal Health (183 samples of 575 checked). Opioid samples are checked for benzodiazepine-positivity using BTNX test strips and the FTIR spectrometer. The results presented here are derived from both of these technologies and are presumptive until confirmed by a laboratory.

March 4, 2025 Vancouver	Down	Caffeine, Desalkylgidazepam, Erythritol, Ortho- Methylfentanyl, Para- Fluorofentanyl	Positive	Positive	Blue granules sold as down in Vancouver tested positive for ortho- methylfentanyl, para-fluorofentanyl, and desalkylgidazepam, a benzo analog.
March 10, 2025 Vancouver	Unknown	Xylitol, Carfentanil	Positive	Negative	Brown granules sold in Vancouver tested positive for carfentanil.
March 10, 2025 Vancouver	Alprazolam (Xanax)	Microcrystalline Cellulose, Uncertain Oil	Positive	Negative	Counterfeit white Xanax tablet sold in Vancouver and expected to contain the benzo alprazolam tested positive for fentanyl and negative for benzos.
March 10, 2025 Vancouver	Unknown	Desalkylgidazepam, Bromazolam, Fentanyl, Medetomidine	Positive	Positive	Yellow granules sold in Vancouver tested positive for fentanyl, benzo analogs desalkylgidazepam and bromazolam, and the tranquilizer medetomidine.
March 17, 2025 Powell River	Down	Erythritol, Caffeine, Fentanyl, Bromazolam, Flubromazepam, Medetomidine*	N/A	N/A	Light pink granules sold in Powell River as down tested positive for fentanyl, benzos, and medetomidine, a tranquilizer more toxic than xylazine.
March 19, 2025 Powell River	Down	Caffeine, Erythritol, Carfentanil*	N/A	N/A	Multiple samples (blue chunks, pink chunks, pink granules) sold as down in Powell River tested positive for carfentanil.
March 21, 2025 Vancouver	Oxycodone	Microcrystalline Cellulose, Calcium Stearate, Uncertain Fentanyl Analog, Uncertain Oil	Positive	Positive	White pressed tablet with imprint "SS/20" sold as oxycodone in Vancouver tested positive for fentanyl and benzos and negative for oxycodone.
March 27, 2025 Vancouver	Unknown	Primidone, Medetomidine, Erythritol**	N/A	N/A	White powder in Vancouver tested positive for primidone (desoxyphenobarbital), a barbiturate sedative, and medetomidine, a tranquilizer more toxic than xylazine. This combination could result in decreased consciousness and/or prolonged sedation that will not respond to naloxone.
March 28, 2025 Powell River	Crack Cocaine	Erythritol, Caffeine, Fentanyl	Positive	Positive	Brown substance sold as crack cocaine in Powell River tested positive for fentanyl and negative for cocaine. Substance has caused overdose.

All spectrometry results are determined by FTIR, with the exception of the following:

Data represented in this report is collected from our partner sites across the province utilizing Fourier Transform Infrared (FTIR) spectrometry in combination with BTNX fentanyl test strips, as well as benzodiazepine test strips when applicable. We note the FTIR spectrometer has a detection limit of approximately 5% concentration (McCrae, 2019).
